Now I'll briefly discuss the hotly debated misconceptions circling around through media and by the acts of extremist groups around the world



SHARIA, JIHAD AND HIJAB, THESE WORDS MIGHT SEEMS FAMILIAR TO YOU BUT DON'T JUDGE BY THE COVER.

Teachings of Islam are very peace - loving Qura'n states:

"There is no compulsion in religion"

Islam doesn't promote enforcement.

It is the matter between man and the God. Nobody is permitted to force anyone for whatsoever in the name of Islam

WHAT IS SHARIAH

Shariah is a misunderstood and misused concept.

A lot of people don't actually know what shariah is... it often translated as law, it doesn't really mean that ...it latterly means a path to life-giving water or guidance, how do you give charityhow do you get married,..... how do praybasic guidelines how to live your life with peace.

Prophet Moses implemented Shariah at his time. And it was basically need of the time. When people were wildly illiterate and uncivilized and there was no law at all to admonish these circumstances. same was the case with the prophet of Islam and He implemented in accordance with reasonable chances.

Shariah was recognised and implemented to civilize the society. It was the need of the time. Now as we have laws and legislations by every state and government therefore Shariah is not to be executed in such situations.

WHAT IS JIHAD?

We will discuss how misinterpreting this word leads to violence and unnecessary bloodshed and what Islam actually teaches regarding Jihad.

- "For you your religion, for me my religion"-(109:7)
- "Whoever kills a person [unjustly]...it is as though he has killed all mankind. And whoever saves a life, it is as though he had saved all mankind."

(Qur'an, 5:33)

The word "Jihad" means struggle, or to be specific, striving in the cause of God. Any struggle done in day-to-day life to please God can be considered Jihad.

Types of Jihad

Inner Jihad:

A personal struggle within one's self to submit to Allah, fight evil within one's self, achieve higher moral and educational standards.

Social Jihad:

Jihad against evil, injustice and oppression within one's self, family and society.

Physical Jihad or an armed struggle:

Jihad against all that prevents Muslims from servitude to God, when a Muslim is removed from their homeland by force

JIHAD OF THE PEN

- This Jihad is carried out through publications e.g. Books, Leaflets etc.
- This is the type of Jihad needed in this era
- Islam should be spread using the pen rather than the sword
- The Promised Messiah (as) came to end violent wars and to spread this type of Jihad by the Pen.

HEAD SCARVES OPPRESSION - OR FREEDOM OF CHOICE

Over the past few years the hijab, or veil, has been made an issue in Europe. In France, in particular, an uproar has been created, and now they are seriously considered legislations to ban the hijab. Following on from France, politicians in other European countries, and for their own political motives, are issuing statements supporting a ban and this is becoming a means of injuring the sentiments of Muslims.

IS THE VEIL UNIQUE TO ISLAM

A modern day misconception is that the veil is worn exclusively by Muslim women. It was established that the women of other faiths have worn the veil throughout history.

- In Christianity, one of the most widely known example, is Mary mother of Jesus, her wearing of a veil has always been used to depict her modesty and humility, A well known Modern day example by Christian nuns, who wears modest outer garments
- Additionally in Judaism women often cover their hair in observance of modesty.

HEAD SCARVES OPPRESSION - OR FREEDOM OF CHOICE

On one side you have Muslim men and governments who insist to cover women from head to toe at all cost, creating an image of oppression in people's minds. On the other side you have European governments who insist that Muslim women wear no covering whether the women like it or not.

Extremists on opposite sides of this debate have engaged in a virtual tug-of-war, and Muslim women are the rope. Caught in the middle, they are told what to do, how to act and what to wear.

In the Quran there are about two verses among 6000 verses that address how should we conduct ourselves when we talk about modesty,

I chose to dress this way for me it really is an outside expression of an inward experience There are few some countries such as Saudi Arabia that limits women's rights. They are taking God given rights that God has given to women and imposing their own views and opinions and what it is that women need to do and not to do. They are ones that contradicting Islam They are the ones that bringing an alien influences into the faith.

Ultimately, it is each Muslim woman's individual responsibility to follow God's commandments. So I think nobody can force Muslim women to practice Islam permitting to their understanding.

In reference with western secularists is this a definition of modern democratic governments that claim to safeguard the rights of its people? Is this the way to bring together people of different nations? Is this the way to foster love and affection amongst people? Most certainly, every just-minded person will oppose this because these things will make the walls of hatred ever higher and destroy the peace of the world. This concludes my presentation That's all I had to say ... just to remove the misconceptions and to promote love and harmony These are the little efforts we are doing within the every level of our community to create peace by bringing communities together.
